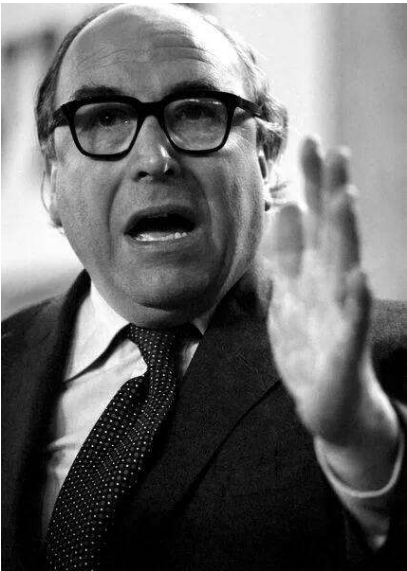

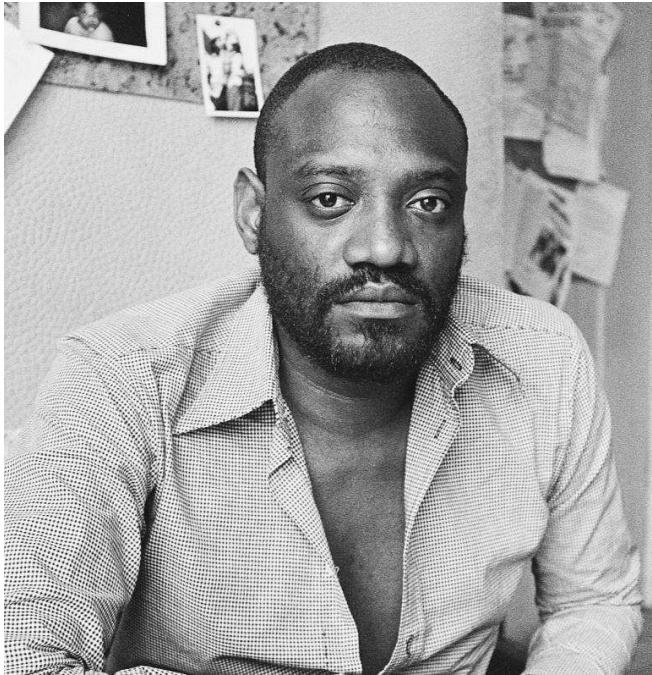
Roy Jenkins OM PC

## Darcus Howe



- Darcus Howe was a British broadcaster, writer and racial justice campaigner.
- Originally from Trinidad, Darcus Howe came to England as a teenager in 1961 with the intentions of studying Law and living in London- there he joined the British Black Panthers.
- In 1970 took part in a protest against the constant police raids of the Mangrove Restaurant where he worked, and which became a meeting place for Black people. Howe and 8 others were arrested for riot, brawling and assault (publicly became known as the Mangrove Nine ). Were released after a 55-day trial in 1971.
- 1973-1985 served as an editor of a magazine, Race Today, which first focused on British Immigration then turned into a radical Black newspaper.

# Grace Powell

## Maajid Nawaz



2 November 1977 (age 44)

England

- A British activist and radio presenter, he is the founding chairman of the counter-extremism, specifically against Islamism called Quilliam.
- Was the host of an LBC radio show on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Nawaz was a former member of the Islamist group Hizb ut-Tahrir, an association that led to his December 2001 arrest in Egypt, where he remained imprisoned until 2006.
